PUBLIC NOTICE

PUBLIC CONSULTATIONS ON THE PROPOSED SUPPLIES PRACTITIONERS MANAGEMENT (GENERAL) REGULATIONS 2026 DEVELOPED IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE SUPPLIES PRACTITIONERS MANAGEMENT ACT (*Cap. 537*)

PURSUANT to Section 36(a), (b), (f), and (h) of the Supplies Practitioners Management Act, 2007, and Section 5 of the Statutory Instruments Act, 2013, the Kenya Institute of Supplies Management hereby notifies members of the Institute and the general public that the Cabinet Secretary for National Treasury in collaboration with the Council has prepared the proposed *Supplies Practitioners Management (General) Regulations, 2026*.

FURTHER, pursuant to Section 8 of the Statutory Instruments Act, the Regulatory Impact Statement is being developed to assess the likely impact of the proposed Regulations on supplies practitioners in Kenya.

The main objective of the proposed Regulations is to give effect to Section 36(a), (b), (f), and (h) of the Act by providing a comprehensive framework for:

- i. the registration and licensing of members of the Institute;
- ii. the recognition of Fellows of the Institute;
- iii. setting standards of professional practice for members;
- iv. scale of fees and professional indemnity frameworks;
- v. regulating the conduct of meetings of the Institute; and
- vi. prescribing procedures for lodging and determination of disciplinary cases for professional misconduct against members.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that supplies practitioners and any other persons likely to be affected by the proposed *Supplies Practitioners Management (General) Regulations, 2026* are invited to participate in public hearings to be conducted by the Institute, in accordance with the schedule set out in **Table 1** below.

Written comments on the proposed *Supplies Practitioners Management (General) Regulations, 2026* and the Regulatory Impact Statement to be circulated may be submitted to reach the undersigned not later than **fourteen (14) days** from the date of publication of this notice.
